

# Aug. 8 Chosen For Bond Voting

The City Council Monday officially set the election for the proposed \$175 million city bond program for Aug. 8, the second Tuesday of next month.

The council passed an ordinance setting the date and listing the 14 propositions that will appear on the ballot sheet.

These range from \$1 million in fire station bonds, the smallest amount set out in one proposition, to \$44.3 million in street improvement bonds, the largest amount in one proposition.

The fire station bonds are contained in Proposition No. 1, followed by propositions for library, park and street improvement bonds, in that order.

**THE FIFTH PROPOSITION** is for the issuance of \$11.8 million storm sewer and related bridge improvement bonds.

Proposition No. 6 is for the issuance of \$23.9 million combined municipal services building bonds (the new city hall). No. 7

calls for issuance of \$15 million "combined municipal services center, underground parking garage, disaster shelter and park plaza bonds."

Proposition No. 8 is for \$9 million to expand Memorial Auditorium to provide more convention facilities.

Ninth on the list is \$12.6 million for Fair Park improvement bonds, followed by Proposition No. 10, calling for issuance of \$500,000 neighborhood services center building bonds in South Dallas.

**NO. 11 IS FOR** issuance of \$6.9 million street improvement bonds for the city's "neighborhood development of people and property program area (code-enforcement area in South Dallas).

Proposition No. 12 is for \$7.5 million in regional airport bonds so that Dallas can match the \$7.5 million raised by Fort Worth and start paying its share of land acquisition costs.

The first 12 propositions will call for levy of a tax to pay for the bonds. The tax will
